

An Early View of A Day in the Life of the Intergenerational Center

In 2024, Catholic Charities broke ground on the 55,000 square-foot Carolyn E. Fugett Intergenerational Center in West Baltimore, with plans to serve area residents of every age and stage of life. The Center will open in spring 2026.

8 a.m.: A busy mom rushes into the building's Head Start entrance, by the towering blue column, to drop off her 1- and 4-year-old children at their Early Head Start and Head Start classrooms. The little ones are excited to see their friends, and with 103 children from birth to 5-years-old filling the nine classrooms, it's a boisterous and nurturing space.

9:15 a.m.: A cluster of older neighbors walk a block from Rosemont Tower, a senior-oriented apartment complex, to the community entrance by the yellow column. They head upstairs to warm up for a 9:30 a.m. dance class hosted by Dance & Bmore in the 3rd floor exercise room.

10:30 a.m.: Meeting rooms throughout the building are filling up. In one, a speech therapist works with a 3-year-old. In another, on-site partners gather to hear about each other's work and align programs and services. In a wing designated for behavioral health services, Catholic Charities therapists are working with clients, in-person and virtually. And a handful of remote workers are hunched over desks in the hoteling space, laptops open and headphones on in the light-filled room.

Noon: A dozen young adults gather in a 3rd floor classroom for construction-related training hosted by Catholic Charities' partner, Requity. Through this workforce development program — and the hands-on experience they get a few blocks away — they'll have the skills to find good-paying jobs right after graduation.

2 p.m.: Head Start parents begin arriving to pick up their children. A few families hurry home; others migrate to the community playgrounds on the west side of the building for more time outside. Some children shift to the after-care room, where they'll play until their parents get off work.

3 p.m.: Elementary and middle-school students pile through the community entrance, excited to start afterschool basketball programs with Catholic Charities' partner, PeacePlayers, on the indoor and outdoor courts of the recreation center. Delicious smells waft from the commercial-grade kitchen, where Requity's culinary training program is preparing dinner for a catering job. Trainees will also sell to-go meals, making the evening a little easier for busy neighbors.

5:30 p.m.: Neighborhood groups gather in the community room, which can hold nearly 100 people. They're planning a candidate forum for later in the month and a get-out-the-vote effort to ensure local interests resonate in city decisions.

7 p.m.: Laughter and friendly jeers echo through the exterior Dome, where local adult basketball leagues gather in the state-of-the-art space year-round.

From morning drop-off to evening gatherings, the Center will be a place where children, families, and neighbors of all ages come together to grow, learn, and support one another. Every day's schedule will bring hope, opportunity, and a stronger sense of community to West Baltimore for generations to come.

A Fighter for Children Seeking Safety in the U.S.

For the past several years, Kevin Esteves Muniz, an attorney at the Esperanza Center, has represented a child who moved to the U.S. to be with his mom in Baltimore.

ollowing her immigration to the United States, a mother discovered that her 4-year-old son had been abandoned by his father in their home country. He was left to largely fend for himself, though he has a rare genetic disorder that requires constant medical interventions.

Working two jobs, his mother paid out-of-pocket for his surgeries and, after his arrival in Baltimore, finally brought him to the Esperanza Center for help.

COMPREHENSIVE AND COMPASSIONATE

This Catholic Charities program provides immigrants with comprehensive and compassionate services related to education, health care, and more.

Kevin is one of eight attorneys at Esperanza's Immigration Legal Services. The team represents more than 100 people annually, around 90% of whom come from Central and South America.

Kevin works with unaccompanied children, who enter the U.S. alone to be united with a family member, often a parent. Supporting each client's trajectory can take years and involves caring about far more than their immigration status.

In the case of this child, for example, accessing health care was an urgent priority. First, his mother needed to gain formal custody. He could then apply for Special Immigrant Juvenile Status, a pathway to permanent

residency that requires demonstrating the child was abandoned or neglected in their home country. Only then, many years after his initial application — could the boy access any U.S. health insurance to manage his intense medical needs.

"YOU FEEL LIKE ... FAMILY"

Kevin's connection to his clients extends well beyond the courtroom. As he builds their case, he hears about gangs that tried to recruit them in their home country or trauma experienced before reaching Maryland. He encourages them to stay in school or earn their GED; to pay taxes as they start working; and to stay out of trouble, as even teenage mischief could lead to deportation.

"In the beginning, you build a lot of rapport with the kids. You feel like you're family members because you know their life story, and you're cheering for them," he explained. ♥

After Changing his Life, he's Helping Others Do the Same

Life experience is a key qualification to work in peer recovery, and Tory Boone has a lot of it.

66 \ \ \ y life consisted of drugs and chaos from the age 1 of 13 – or really before that," he explained.

Growing up in Baltimore City's Cherry Hill neighborhood, he was a "latchkey kid" who remembers longing to join the other children playing outside. By the time he did, crime and drugs were part of the game.

He's now 51 years old, a graduate of Catholic Charities' Christopher Place Employment Academy, and working at a treatment center for substance use disorder as he trains to be a peer recovery specialist. That's a career that will allow him to use his experience to provide guidance, mentorship or support to others.

"DOWNWARD SPIRAL"

When Tory was selling drugs, he was still getting high, ignoring the cautions of older guys who had told him, "Don't play with it." When he looks back at that time, he recognizes how often he was crying for help.

"I was rattling the fence. I didn't want to stop what I was doing because that was my source of income, but I knew I needed change," he said. "I was in a downward spiral, and everything was coming to a halt for me."

He moved in with his uncle who told Tory he had one week to decide his next step. That's what drove him into an addiction and treatment center and, shortly after, to Christopher Place, the residential program that offers education, training and recovery services.

PASSING IT ON

In school, Tory had always been a straight-A student, and he wanted to race through the two-year program. Staff responded by letting him debate and question the process, while holding him to the path.

"They were so patient with me. They gave me tough love, but they also gave me patience. I don't know what they did, but it worked," he said.

Many of his peers moved into warehouse, construction or healthcare jobs. Tory was more interested in the work of the peer recovery coach and signed up for Villa Maria Behavioral Health's Peer Recovery Training. He continues training for a similar role after graduating from the program in summer 2025.

"When I really look back at things, I can see all the accomplishments along the course. It puts a smile on my face, and I keep going," he said. "That's what I'm trying to transfer to the guys I work with now."

Decades of Service that Still Feel Rewarding

Carol Baker found her professional calling on her front porch.

he was in her late teens, and her older brother was working with people with intellectual and developmental disabilities. One afternoon, she came home to find him sitting beside a man who had cerebral palsy, just passing time together.

"I was thinking, how did he get the wheelchair up here? But what really fascinated me was watching my brother serve him," she said. "I still always say it's an honor and a blessing to serve others."

A few weeks later, Carol found a job in the same field and, in 1991, she was hired by Gallagher Services, which provides residential and day program supports to adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities. For nearly 35 years, she has helped residents in supportive housing live the life of their choice, now as a community manager for two homes in Anne Arundel County.

SUPPORTING THE LIFE OF THEIR CHOICE

The men in those homes range in age from late 20s to early 70s. Supporting their needs and interests can vary widely. While one resident may need significant medical attention, another might want to volunteer in the community or spend time at the Gallagher Services Meaningful Day Center. As much as possible, how they live their lives is up to them.

Once, when Carol was out getting ice cream with one of the residents, he mentioned that he wanted a job, specifically with an ice cream truck. So, she helped him with the job application and helped the truck owner better understand the man's skills.

"And guess what? He's working there three days a week," she said, delighted. "He loves it, earns his own money, goes to the bank and is just as happy as he can be."

She's also learned not to say "no" unless it's necessary. When one resident wanted to learn to drive, Carol's staff knew it was a bad idea.

"I said, OK, but let the MVA tell him that, not us. Let's get him the book and let him take the test," she said.

"THIS IS MY PLACE"

A lot has changed over 35 years. As Carol explained, "Our people are getting older. And I'm getting older!"

Her brother moved on to another career, but the draw of this work never lessened for her.

"I think the surprise is it doesn't feel old," she said. "I just feel like this is my place – for the people, for serving, for growth. It still feels fresh and rewarding." >

Feeding a Lifelong Passion for Learning

Leonard Coples can pinpoint the start of his interest in health care: 1970s television shows.

would watch TV as a kid, and I would see these doctors and surgeons... It caught my attention. I like the physiology and anatomy," he said. "I was drawn to it."

The now-61-year-old ended up spending much of his career in health care, serving in various hospital-and agency-based roles, constantly exploring his next steps. When he stumbled on Catholic Charities' Compassionate Caregivers program, he recognized the potential it offered.

A GOOD JOB - IN CONSTANT DEMAND

Earlier this year, Leonard and 23 classmates spent 16 weeks learning the skills needed to be a certified nursing assistant (CNA) or geriatric nursing assistant (GNA), jobs in constant demand across Maryland and beyond. Partner program IT Works Learning Center provided the training and helped with job placements, while Compassionate Caregivers ensured participants had the supports needed to be successful, including a daily stipend, help with transportation, access to behavioral health programs and more.

The training was intense: more than 100 classroom hours in evening sessions lasting until 10:30 p.m., 40 hours of hands-on clinical rotations, and constant testing to ensure participants mastered the skills. Despite the stringent standards, every participant in Leonard's cohort completed the free program, and after passing state certification exams, most planned for work in assisted-living facilities. Much of this success was due to Catholic Charities' provision of wraparound care to program participants.

SEIZING EVERY OPPORTUNITY

Even in his 60s, Leonard hasn't tempered his career ambitions. He sees the CNA/GNA certification as a steppingstone – another opportunity to learn, advance his skills and work toward a management position in a field he's loved since childhood.

"He just studies as if he has to pass a test tomorrow. He does not stop studying," said Leonard's daughter, Chadras Coples, reflecting on his drive to learn. "His apartment is just books — about everything you can think of."

Of course, Leonard's drive echoes in his daughter: she's pursuing a degree as a registered nurse and wondering whether they can take a phlebotomy class together next year.

GUIDED BY Lave

Going the Extra Step to Help Seniors Age in Place

If Tanesha Ray learns a resident of Village Crossroads didn't pay their BGE bill, she turns into a detective.

◀ he Catholic Charities senior community where she works in Baltimore County includes nearly 200 apartments in two buildings for people age 62 or older. As the community's service coordinator, she answers questions, plans educational and social gatherings, and provides confidential assistance – all aimed at helping residents thrive and age in place.

With an unpaid BGE bill, she wants to help resolve the charge quickly and ensure it doesn't become a bigger problem. That requires detective work. Did they receive the bill? Should they be connected to payment supports? Did they forget to pay due to cognitive issues? Are they short on funds because they're supporting other family members? Answering these questions, she connects the resident to exactly the right resources to respond to their challenge.

"Ultimately, the goal is to get to the bottom of it, so it doesn't become a bigger issue," she said. "We have a beautiful property. Me being here is just the icing on the cake!"

ALWAYS WITH A SMILE

Janice Moten moved into Village Crossroads II in 2018. The building was brand new, and she loved its location - just six minutes from her family - its affordability, and the sense of peace she felt within it.

"To have someplace where I could come and go, could afford, and still be in my community, near my family – it was a plus," she said. "And the staff was just a blessing."

Older adults may not know who to call, what forms to fill out or how to get the information they need, but they don't want to "feel like a bother," Janice explained. That's why welcoming service coordinators is such a benefit.

"They are personality plus," she said of Tanesha and her colleagues. "They just draw you in. They make you want to come in and ask a question."

Tanesha knocks on doors and greets residents in the hallways. She organizes Christmas karaoke, Valentine's Day bingo and milkshake mixers to alleviate isolation, supports residents applying for benefits, and offers relevant educational programs on health, technology and more.

"I'm just building that relationship, letting them know I'm here for them – here to serve them," Tanesha said.






